### AIA Michigan Director's Report

2014 was an eventful year for AIA Michigan. One of the most trying issues for the Board was the decision to sell our beloved Beaubien House and relocate to a much smaller leased space in Midtown Detroit. Primarily financial issues drove the difficult decision. The new office location is slated for completion in the Spring. Watch for information to come about the move-in date so that you can visit *your* state headquarters and check it out! We will continue to see organizational changes as we move into 2015.



One issue that continues to loom large on the horizon is that of "repositioning". It is a term that has been floating around AIA National for a while but what it means to local chapters is still somewhat unclear. I will keep members posted as I learn more, but my current understanding is that there will be organizational changes to AIA Flint. Of particular concern is the directive that the minimum membership to be considered a chapter has been set at 100, meaning that several of Michigan's chapters will have to merge to meet the new standard. AIA Michigan will hold Town Hall meetings for each Chapter to explain the changes and get local members' feedback. Please plan to attend and help shape the future direction of our Chapter.

### **Parking Day**



Park(ing) Day is a national one day event designed to promote the value of cities' parks. Flint has more green space that most cities in the country. To celebrate the wealth of parks, local people create min-parks in downtown parking spaces. The AIA Flint 2014 Park(ing) Day streetscape intervention explores the origins of Saginaw Street as a glacial moraine first traversed by Native Americans, evolution to the present, and impending future.
