### AIA FLINT ARCHITECTURE SCHOLARSHIP

The AIA Flint Architecture Scholarship Fund was established to encourage and assist students graduating from high schools in the Flint Chapter region (Genesee, Shiawassee, and Lapeer Counties) and existing college students to pursue a professional degree in architecture at a college or university with a NAAB accredited architecture program, or an associate degree in architectural technology. The fund is administered by the AIA Flint Chapter of the American Institute of Architects.

## Attachments - Please provide the following items and attach to your application:

- Provide an official, sealed transcript (high school students), or current official, sealed college transcript\*
   \*First year college students must submit an official high school transcript and a college transcript
- 2. Two letters of recommendation from a teacher, professor, guidance counselor, coach or employer.
- 3. An essay outlining educational/career goals as they relate to the field of architecture one page, typed, double-spaced.
- 4. A list of honors for scholastic achievement as well as non-academic activities, honors, awards, community service and co-curricular activities (athletics, debate, dramatics, music, etc.). Include any architecture/design events in which you have participated.
- 5. If you are a high school senior/prospective college student, a copy of the college's acceptance letter.
- 6. Submit a minimum of two and a maximum of four images of works that represent your artistic abilities (renderings, sketches, models, photographs, drafting, painting, sculptures, etc.) The medium/media used in the works (e. g. acrylic, cardboard, ink, etc.) must be identified. Please also identify the size of the original piece and provide a title. You must send your images as .jpeg files (300 dpi at 4 inches wide) on a CD.

#### **Scholarship Applicant Criteria**

To be eligible, applicants must:

- Be a U.S. Citizen
- Student must have received or anticipate receiving his or her high school diploma from a high school in the
  geographic area, or base residence be in the area represented by the Flint Chapter of the American Institute
  of Architects, i.e., Genesee, Shiawassee and Lapeer counties in Michigan.
- Student must be newly accepted or currently enrolled in a program with an associate degree in architectural technology, an NAAB accredited architecture program at a university or college, or be in a pre-architecture program and declare architecture as his or her primary course of study.
- Student must not be a past recipient of an AIA Flint Architecture Scholarship.

#### Size and frequency of the Scholarship

A maximum of \$1,000.00 will be available for awarding scholarships. However, the AIA Flint Chapter Selection Committee may elect not to award a scholarship if, in its judgment, a suitable candidate or candidates cannot be identified.

# Use of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be used for tuition and related educational expenses only. Payment will be made by AIA Flint directly to the educational institution attended by the applicant. Recipients will be notified and announced in June, 2015.
